A.R.T. Tournament Held at Fountain Bowl Free Entry for League Bowlers

Fountain Bowl's Tennelle Milligan Vies for "Queens"

Bowlers Journal International's E-Bowler recently featured an article on our own Tennelle Milligan, Manager of Barry Asher's Custom Embroidery. Milligan was the defending champion of the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Queens title when a field of more than 300 battled it out for the 2006 Queens record prize of \$200,000. The Queens is presented by Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus Hotels/Casinos. This year's event took

place June 17-21 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada.

Last year's Queens title was Milligan's fourth professional title and her third major one. She had also won the Women's U.S. Open and Players Championship in 2000. Before turning professional, Milligan had a very successful amateur career, having won one gold and two bronze medals in the 1999 Pan Am Games. She had been a multi-medalist, too, in the

1999 Federation Internationale des Quilleurs (FIQ) World Championships, the 1997 Tournament of the Americas, and the 1997 FIQ World Youth Championships.

The 2006 Queens format featured a 10-game qualifying round, bowled in a pair of five-game blocks, which reduced the field to the top 100. Survivors rolled five more games, and the top 63 (based on 15-game totals) joined Milligan in the double-elimination match play. Milligan won the first

The bowlers were entered into the highest division in which they qualified, and the handicap for each was based on the bowler's highest average at Fountain Bowl with a minimum of 21 games. The tournament consisted of bowling 3 games, with the top four finishers in each division going on to the TV style roll-offs on June 25.

The cash prizes for each of the men's and women's divisions were graduated down from 1st to 25th, with a total of 150 bowlers "cashing" in the tournament! The shared cash prizes for the top twenty-five bowlers in the men's and women's divisions were:

This year more than 1,400 house bowlers had rolled qualifying games, and of that number, 843 signed up to bowl in the tour-

What's a "bowling trailer" and what's it doing at Fountain Valley High School? The trailer lane is a regulation lane, except for its shortened length. It's about half the length of a real lane. A variety of different weight balls is available for each bowler to use. It even comes staffed by volunteers who know what they're doing and have fun doing it!

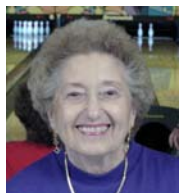
great life serving Christ." He has built his whole life reaching out and helping others.

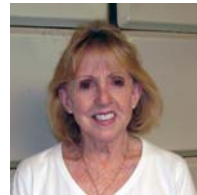

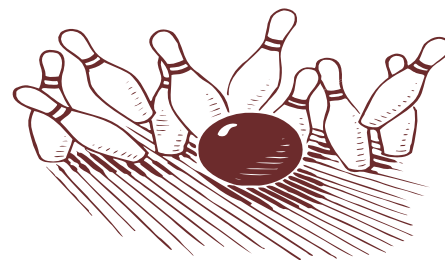
Gavin Hawk, who has worked at Fountain for 20 years, will take over for Bob.
