SENIOR CASINO

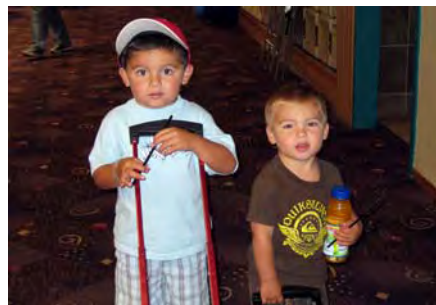

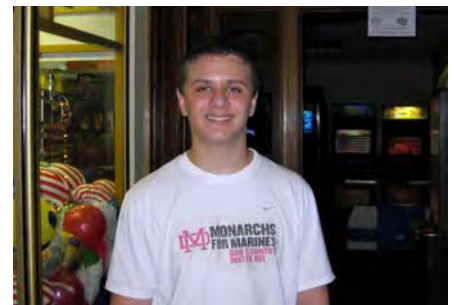
